Section 4 - Framing and Matting

SECTION I

Varsity basketball will be played on a seasonal basis. The basketball game regularly scheduled during the week of the Conference master schedule is the game that counts in determining the regular season divisional champ.

SECTION II

A BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT WILL BE HELD EACH YEAR

- 1. The conference basketball tournament will begin on Saturday of week 30 of the NSAA calendar and end on Monday of week 32 of the NSAA calendar.
- 2. Teams will be seeded 1 through 10/11 according to NSAA power points. Seeding shall be on Monday of week 30. Games played through Saturday of week 29 will count toward seeding. For 1st round games, the host school will be placed on the top of the bracket.
- 3. Seeding Procedure, Tie breaking system:
 - a. In case of ties for seeding, the following procedures will be used:
 - b. Head to head competition.
 - c. Total season record as %.
 - d. Winning % vs. mutual opponents.
 - e. Flip of coin.
- 4. See the tournament bracket on page 34 to page 37. Brackets will be attached
- 5. The conference will appoint co-directors for the tournament with each receiving a maximum of \$75.00 and no more than \$150.00 total for the event to arrange games, sites, and officials.
- 6. NSAA rules and guidelines will govern the tournament.

- 7. The boys' games will be played on Saturday, Tuesday, Friday, Saturday, Monday.
- 8. The girls' games will be played on Saturday, Monday, Thursday, Saturday, and Monday.
- 9. In all rounds except for the Saturday Consolation Championship, the host school would be the highest seed, provided their gym seats at least 750 people. If the #1 seed cannot host, it would go to the #2 seed, then #3, and then #4, in that order. In the consolation championship, the highest seed of the 3rd place game will be the host. If a schools boys and girls team are to host on consolation Saturday, the basketball committee will have the right to adjust the schedule as needed.
- 10. Cheerleaders in uniform will be admitted free of charge.
- 11. Receipts from the basketball tournament will be divided as follows:
 - a. First round game & second round-host school to receive \$100 or 10% of the gross whichever is greater. Quarter final and semi-final round games, the host school to receive 20% of gross or \$150 per night, whichever is greater. Host sites for the tournament will be responsible for paying the officials. The conference will reimburse host schools utilizing the financial forms filed at the conclusion of the tournament. The tournament director will notify the host sites of the amount to be paid according to the constitution.
 - b. Official expense & championship site expense.
 - c. Balance to the Conference treasury.
- 12. The duties of Conference Secretary and Tournament Co-Directors will be to make arrangements at site selected, hiring and paying officials, arrange for the delivery and presentation of the Conference trophy, and handle programming and advertising.
- 13. Basketball Tournament Postponement/Cancellation procedures. The following are the procedures for the postponement or cancellations.
 - a) If the first round games on Saturday are postponed, the Conference will move the first round games to Monday. The girls first round will be moved to Tuesday. This will move the boys Tuesday games to Wednesday and the girls will remain on Thursday.
 - b) If the first round games for the girls, on Monday, are postponed, the Conference will move the girls' first round games to Tuesday. This will move the boys first round Tuesday games to Wednesday.
 - c) If the boys' games, on Tuesday, are postponed, the Conference will run the boys games on Wednesday and the girls will continue on schedule for Thursday.
 - d) If the girls' games, on Thursday, are postponed, move the girls' games to Friday. The boys' games will move to Saturday. The consolation championship games on Saturday would be canceled. The finals will remain on Monday.
 - e) If the boys' games on Friday are postponed, move the boys' games to Saturday. The consolation championship games on Saturday would be canceled. The finals will remain on Monday.
 - f) If the Consolation Championship games on Saturday are not able to be played they will be canceled. If the finals on Monday night are postponed, the finals will be played on the following Wednesday night.
 - g) If the first four nights of the tournament are postponed, there will be a shortened tournament with the top 8 seeded teams. The girls' games will be played on Thursday night at the highest seed sites. The boys' games will be played on Friday night at the highest seed sites. The semi-final round would be played Saturday for the girls and boys' basketball tournament, the host school would be the highest seed, provided their gym seats at least 750 people. If the #1 seed cannot host, it would go to the #2

seed, then #3, and then #4, in that order. The Championship would be played on Monday with no consolation games.

- h) If the tournament can not start by Friday of week 31 the tournament will be canceled. If the tournament's first day is Friday, the basketball committee will determine an abbreviated schedule and locations.
- i) Officials' contracts: A statement should be added to the contracts indicating an alternate schedule. Officials will be paid 120% of NSAA district pay.
- j) A conference plaque insert for the champion and runner-up will be presented along with fourteen medallions for each team competing in the finals.

SECTION III

Basketball All-Conference Selection Procedure

- 1. Selection of All-Conference basketball Players will be limited to a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd team, totalling 15 players plus ties.
- 2. Coaches may nominate as many players as they want. This will be done in three separate rounds, with coaches nominating accordingly.
- 3. Coaches should list their nominations in order with their best player first, second best second, etc.
- 4. After all nominations have been given to the person in charge, each coach may give a short summary on each of their players.
- 5. A ballot will be typed up and each coach will vote for what they consider to be the top five players.
- 6. Coaches cannot vote for their own players.
- 7. The coaches will assign 5 points to their first choice, 4 points to their second choice, 3 points to their third choice and so forth.
- 8. The player receiving the most points will be considered the best player/captain of the all-conference team. The top **5** point getters in each of the three rounds will be considered All-Conference.
- 9. All players receiving a vote but not making the top 15 plus ties will receive Honorable Mention.
- 10. If there is a tie between the **15**th and **16**th..... place players, an extra medallion/s may be awarded. If there is a tie for 1st or 2nd team members the player with the most (5's), (4's) etc will be chosen for that team.

Lewis & Clark Conference Proposal for the Conference Track & Field Meet Track & Field Committee: Greg Conn, Joe Ortmeier, and Dave Uldrich

- 1. Track & Field Venues in the Lewis and Clark Conference:
 - a. Creighton High School (6 Lanes including Pole Vault)
 - b. Randolph High School (6 Lanes, no Pole Vault)
 - c. Homer High School (7 Lanes including Pole Vault)
 - d. Winnebago High School (8 Lanes including Pole Vault)
- 2. Rotating the Conference Track Meet from East to West each year using the four Track & Field Venues mentioned above.
- 3. Scoring six places: 10-8-6-4-2-1
- 4. Medaling six places
- 5. Qualifying for the finals:
 - a. Qualifying 8 competitors for the finals in the Long Jump, Triple Jump, Shot Put, and Discus.
 - b. Qualifying 6 competitors for the finals of the $100/110 \,\mathrm{HH}$, $100 \,\mathrm{m}$, and $200 \,\mathrm{m}$ at Creighton and Randolph.
 - c. Qualifying 7 competitors for the finals of the 100/110HH, 100m and 200m at Homer.
 - d. Qualifying 8 competitors for the finals of the 100/110HH, 100m and 200m at Winnebago.
- 6. Timing: We will rent the F.A.T timing equipment.

7. Rational:

- a. We have four excellent Track & Field venues on both sides of the conference.
- b. While scoring and medaling 6 places, we will be able to use the two six lane track venues at both Creighton and Randolph in the rotation giving the conference two venues on the West and two venues on the East.
- c. Now with 12 schools competing, there will be more opportunities for athletes to place even though we are only medaling six places and still maintain the meaning of placing at the Lewis & Clark Conference Track & Field Meet.
- d. By medaling six places instead of eight, it will be consistent with all of the Track & field venues we will be using.
- e. By medaling six places instead of eight, will also reduce the cost of medals.

Conference Band Director's Proposal

We propose to have a 9-12th grade nominated Honor Band. Each band director can nominate up to 12 students. There will be a chair audition procedure for seating and medals as in the current handbook. Instrumentation will be:

Piccolo-1, Flute-8-10, Clarinets-12-15, Bass Clarinet-1-2, Contrabass Clarinet-1, Alto Sax-6-8, Tenor Sax-2-3, Bari Sax-1-2, Trumpet-12-15, French Horn-2-4, Trombone-10-12, Baritone-2-4, Tuba-3-4, Batter Percussion-4-6, Timpani-1, Mallet Percussion-2-3.

We also propose to have a 7-8th grade nominated honor band. Participants will not medal. The purpose of this ensemble is to promote participation in future conference honor band events. Instrumentation will mirror the 9-12th grade ensemble.

The co-hosts and clinicians will finalize the musical selections by November 1st, after consulting with the other Conference Band Directors at the October meeting.

This event will be held on January 18th, 2025 at Wayne State College

Conference Choir Director's Proposal

We propose the Lewis & Clark sides of the Conference combine for Conference Vocal Clinic. Each school will be encouraged to bring their entire choir. The Honor Choir will consist of 36 members including 9 Sopranos, 9 Altos, 9 Tenors and 9 Basses. Each member of the Honor Choir will medal. Each auditioning school will be guaranteed at least 1 participant in the Honor Choir. The Honor Choir will now perform 2 selections at the concert. Each school will no longer perform individual selections for the final concert. The Mass Choir will have 4 - 5 selections. The Treble choir will have 1 selection and the Bass choir will have 1 selection. The co-hosts and clinician will finalize the musical selections by June 1st, after consulting with the other Conference Vocal Directors at the May meeting.

We propose the centrally located schools become a 2-year host site and the directors would co-host with the outlying school Districts. We propose the following partnerships. The schools highlighted in red would be the host site.

ARTICLE IX - VOLLEYBALL

SECTION I

Girl's volleyball will be played on a seasonal basis. All provisions are to follow the NSAA guidelines and regulations as outlined by the Board of Directors. Conference teams will be divided into two divisions for regular season play:

Each division will play each member school in the division to determine divisional champion. The order of volleyball games will be C-B-A. A-team volleyball matches shall comply with the NSAA regulations. B-team volleyball matches shall be 2 out of 3 to 25 points with a cap of 27. The deciding game will go to 15 pts. C-team volleyball matches shall be 2 out of 3 to 25 points with a 27 point cap. The deciding game will go to 15 pts. B-team shall have a maximum of 11 minutes warm-up time. Division Conference standings will be determined by Conference Division win/loss records. Division conference standings are determined by play of division opponents in the following order: Duals matches, then triangular matches, and then quads/tournaments. If you are in two triangulars the first one played counts as the divisional match. All Conference contests shall begin at 5:30 pm (CBA) and 6:00 p.m. (BA). Triangular times shall be left up to the individual schools. One plaque shall be awarded to each regular season division champion.

SECTION III Conference Volleyball Tournament Procedures


- 1. The Conference will appoint co-directors for the tournament with each to receive a maximum of \$75.00 and no more than \$150.00 total. For the tournament to arrange games, sites, and officials.
- 2. The Conference Volleyball Tournament will be played on Saturday of week 16 of the NSAA calendar and Monday and Tuesday of week 17 of the NSAA calendar.
- 3. Tournament seeding to use all games played through Monday of week 16. All teams will be seeded from highest to lowest according to their NSAA power points at the time of the seeding.

- 4. In case of ties for seeding, the following procedures will be used:
 - a. Head to head competition
 - b. Total season record as %
 - c. Winning % vs. mutual opponents
 - d. Flip of coin
- 5. One plaque insert will be awarded to each regular season division champion and two tournament plaque inserts awarded, one for the champion and one for the runner up: Medals will be awarded to the tournament champion and runner up.

SECTION IV

Volleyball All-Conference Selection Procedure

- 1. Selection of All-Conference volleyball players will be limited to 10 players in each division.
- 2. Coaches may nominate as many players as they want.
- 3. Coaches should list their nominations in order with their best player first, second best second, etc.
- 4. After all nominations have been given to the person in charge, each coach may give a short summary on each of their players.
- 5. A ballot will be typed up and each coach will vote for who they consider to be the top ten players.
- 6. Coaches don't vote for their own players.
- 7. The coaches will assign 10 points to their first choice, 9 points to their second choice, 8 points to their third choice and so forth.
- 8. The player receiving the most points will be considered the best player in that division. The top **10** point getters will be considered All-Conference.
- 9. All players receiving a vote but not making the top 10 will receive Honorable Mention.
- 10. If there is a tie between the 10th and 11th place players, an extra medallion may be awarded.



BOYS WRESTLING

The East Husker Conference and Lewis & Clark Conference shall conduct a boys wrestling tournament for their member schools to be held the Saturday of the 30th week of the NSAA standardized calendar.

The site of the meet will be determined on a rotation among member schools (SEE Rotation at the end of the document).

SEEDING

- 1. Seeding shall take place at 8:30 a.m. on the Saturday morning of the tournament.
- 2. Only individual wrestling records of .500 or above shall be seeded and the remaining wrestlers with records below .500 drawn into the brackets.
- 3. The criteria for seeding shall follow those suggested in the NSAA wrestling manual.
- 4. Brackets, bracket advancement, and scoring will be done by Track Wrestling.

TOURNAMENT FORMAT

Each wrestler in the tournament will be seeded according to criteria. The tournament will run in a traditional 32-man, bracketed, double elimination format. Weight classes with 6 or fewer wrestlers will utilize a pool-style bracket. Tournament format will be determined by the number of entries at the entry deadline and will not change following the Drop/Add meeting. The tournament will be conducted using Track Wrestling.

Teams will be allowed to enter JV wrestlers into the conference tournament as long as the total number of wrestlers for the team does not exceed 18 wrestlers. Teams will designate one wrestler per weight class entered as a scorer for team point purposes. Brackets will NOT exceed 32 wrestlers per weight.

Match Format

Matches in the winner's bracket will be 2-2-2, and consolation matches in the bracket will be 1-2-2.

Team Scoring

Final bracket/medal-round scoring:

Advancement Points: 2 points for advancement to the championship match in the bracket and 1 point for advancement to the consolation $3^{rd}/4^{th}$ match in the bracket.

Bonus Points: 2 points for a pin, 1.5 for tech fall, 1 for major decision (8-14).

Placement Points: 14 for 1st place, 10 for 2nd place, 7 for 3rd place, 4 for 4th place.

Pool Format Scoring: All scoring will be calculated by Track Wrestling. Bonus and Placement points will be the same as if it were a bracketed format.
